Newlands Coal

Newlands Coal is located 33 kilometres north-west of the township of Glenden, in the northern part of Queensland's Bowen Basin, approximately 190 kilometres west of Mackay.

Operation

Newlands Coal was an established open cut mine, with associated coal handling and processing infrastructure. The facility produced thermal and metallurgical coal for export through the Port of Abbot Point.

In 2023, Newlands Coal Mine came to the end of its mine life, as planned, after 40 years of operation. The milestone marked the beginning of a new era for the site as focus shifted to mine closure and rehabilitation works.

The total area of land managed by Newlands Coal is 32,633 hectares.



Operational timeline:

1981

Development at Newlands began, with the official mine opened in December.

1983

Open cut coal operations commenced in the Newlands Main Deposit.

1995

Open cut coal operations were extended to Eastern Creek (1995), Suttor Creek (2004) and Wollombi (2006).

1998

Underground mining began with the opening of the Southern Underground. This was then replaced by the Northern Underground.

2014

Highwall mining operations commenced at Suttor Creek.

2016

Underground coal operations ceased.

2017

73ha of rehabilitated land was signed-off by Queensland Government, a first in Queensland's coal industry.

2021

Another 162ha of rehabilitated land was signed-off by Queensland Government.

2023

Last coal was mined after 40 years of operation. The milestone marked the beginning of a new era for the site as focus shifted to mine closure and rehabilitation works.

Entire workforce transitioned from mining coal to rehabilitation in April 2023. Total saleable tonnes over the life of mine of Newlands equated to 228,179,950 million tonnes.

Environmental management

Newlands Coal has a comprehensive Environmental Management System (EMS) in place. The EMS provides a framework for dealing with environmental management issues across all areas of the mine, in a systematic way. The EMS covers the design, development, production, maintenance and rehabilitation of the operation and its infrastructure.

Prior to mining operations, the predominant land use in the area was cattle grazing on native and improved pastures.

A single Environmental Authority covers all environmental management activities for the Newlands Coal Mine.

Newlands is transitioning to a Progressive Rehabilitation & Closure Plan (PRCP) during 2024. The PRCP describes when and how land is rehabilitated through to full mine closure.

Rehabilitation

Newlands Coal progressively rehabilitates land no longer required for mining purposes. As of December 2023, 4,028ha of mined land has been rehabilitated.

By the end of 2030, more than 8,500 ha of land will be rehabilitated at Newlands.

Community investment

Newlands Coal is passionate about contributing to their local community of Glenden.

By proudly supporting local community projects and events, as well as investing in partnership programs which target education, childcare, health, sporting and cultural activities, Newlands Coal seeks to deliver positive and lasting social and economic benefits in the region.

Each year Newlands Coal invests approximately \$40,000 in community partnerships and projects through Smarty Grants funding.
